The proposed change would not alter the total amount of advertising permitted each hour.

The licensee proposes to delete condition of licence 4d) which reads as follows:

The licensee shall not broadcast any paid advertising material other than national paid advertising.

and to amend condition of licence 4a) which reads as follows:



Except as otherwise provided in subparagraphs b) and c), the licensee shall not broadcast more than twelve (12) minutes of advertising material during each clock hour.

with the following condition:

Except as otherwise provided in subparagraphs b) and c), the licensee shall not distribute more than twelve (12) minutes of advertising material during each clock hour, of which no more than six (6) minutes may consist of local or regional advertising.

3. Québec, Saint-Joachim, Sainte-Pétronille, Quebec Application No. 2005-0767-6

Application by **Vidéotron Itée**, on behalf of itself and its subsidiary Videotron (Regional) Ltd., collectively called Vidéotron, to amend the licences of the cable distribution undertakings serving the above-mentioned locations.

Vidéotron requests an exemption, by condition of licence, from the requirement under section 25(a) of the *Broadcasting Distribution Regulations* in order to continue distribution of its community channel on channel 9 which has become a restricted channel.

In *New low-power community television station in Québec* – Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2003-413 dated 22 August 2003, the Commission authorized a new low-power community television station in Québec (Télé-Mag inc.) on channel 9. Further to that authorization, channel 9 on the above cable undertakings became a restricted channel.

Vidéotron is of the view that it is preferable to use the only VHF frequency still available on the basic band for the new television station and to leave the community channel on channel 9 because that is the known channel for community programming almost everywhere in the province of Quebec.
