CH4150 Fort Smith – Licence renewal

- 1. The Commission **renews** the broadcasting licence for the native television programming undertaking CH4150 Fort Smith, from 1 April 2006¹ to 31 August 2012.
- 2. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.
- 3. The Commission notes that the station is currently not broadcasting because of technical difficulties and concerns with respect to funding. In its licence renewal application, the licensee presented its plans to put the station back into operation in the immediate future. The licensee indicated that it broadcast 14 hours of programming in each week. The station will broadcast between 6:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m., seven days a week.
- 4. The licence will be subject to the **conditions** specified therein, as well as to the **conditions** set out in the appendix to this decision.

Conditions of licence

- 1. The licensee is relieved from the requirements of section 10 of the *Television Broadcasting Regulations*, 1987 with regard to the retention of program logs or machine-readable records of its programming.
- 2. The licensee shall adhere to the guidelines on the depiction of violence in television programming set out in the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' *Voluntary code regarding violence in television programming*, as amended from time to time and approved by the Commission.
