1. **Atlantic Canada** **Application No. 2007-0993-3**

Application by **CTV Television Inc.** to amend the licence of the satellite to cable programming undertaking known as Atlantic Satellite Network (ASN).

The licensee proposes to add the following condition of licence:

The licensee shall not solicit local advertising in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador.

CTV states that this application is the result of its support of Rogers Cable Communications Inc.'s (Rogers) application (2005-1501-7) for a Class 1 regional licence for cable broadcasting distribution undertakings (BDUs) in New Brunswick and in Newfoundland and Labrador including the deletion of the condition of licence for its existing St. John's BDU requiring that commercial messages likely to have a negative effect on Newfoundland Broadcasting Company Limited (NTV) be deleted from ASN.

The Commission approved in Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2006-459, 31 August 2006, *Class 1 regional licence for broadcasting distribution undertakings in New Brunswick and in Newfoundland and Labrador*, the application by Rogers. The Commission notes the following in paragraph 29:

“CTV also advised that ASN would be willing to accept a condition of licence prohibiting it from soliciting local advertising in St. John’s, as a means to reassure NTV that ASN would not compete for revenues in NTV’s home market. CTV stated that, should the Commission approve Rogers’ request, ASN would immediately apply to amend its own licence to prohibit it from soliciting local advertising in St. John’s”.
