- 3. The licence will be subject to the terms and **conditions of licence** set out in the appendix to this decision.



Terms and conditions of licence

Terms

The licence will expire 31 August 2015.

Conditions of licence

- 1. The licence will be subject to the conditions set out in *New licence form for commercial radio stations*, Public Notice CRTC 1999-137, 24 August 1999, with the exception of conditions of licence 1 and 5.
- 2. If the licensee originates 42 or more hours of programming in any broadcast week, the licensee will adhere to the Canadian Association of Broadcasters' *Equitable Portrayal Code*, as amended from time to time and approved by the Commission. However, the application of the foregoing condition of licence will be suspended if the licensee is a member in good standing of the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council.
