Re: Fulfillment of Competitive Local Exchange Obligations

Wightman Communications Ltd. ("Wightman") is pleased to inform the Commission that it has met the Commission's Competitive Local Exchange Carrier ("CLEC") obligations as set out in CRTC Telecom Decision 97-8, Local Competition ("Decision 97-8"). As a result, Wightman is ready to offer services beginning as early as Oct.11, 2005 in a number of Local Interconnection Regions (LIRs) within the 519 NPA. (Specifically the Walkerton, Hanover, Mount Forest, Harriston and Stratford exchanges.)

Specifically, Wightman has completed the following activities:

- has obtained a central office code (NXX) for each exchange in which it intends to offer service and has designated a point of interconnection ("POI") for each LIR in the 519 NPA in which it is interconnected.
- has completed all interconnection agreements between itself and the carriers with which it exchanges traffic. A copy of these agreements has been filed with the CRTC for its approval including the MALI, BLIF and 911 agreements.
- has filed with the Commission and received interim approval as of Aug.25, 2005 on its interconnection tariffs for Local Exchange Carriers ("LECs"), Interexchange Carriers ("IXCs"), and Wireless Service Providers ("WSPs").
- has implemented Local Number Portability ("LNP").
- can provide Message Relay Service ("MRS") to its local customers.
- will treat CLEC generated calls between ILECs' exchanges where ILEC's toll charges are applicable as toll calls for contribution payment purposes (if applicable to Wightman).

- can provide 9-1-1 service to its local customers using Bell Canada's Emergency Services (911) Tariff.
- has included in its interconnection tariff the terms and conditions under which it will provide subscriber listings to other LECs. (BLIF)
- can ensure that its end-users have direct access, under reasonable terms and conditions, to services provided by any other LEC serving in the exchange.
- has made our Terms of Service known to potential customers. A copy of these Terms has been filed previously with the CRTC.
- has made serving area maps available upon request at its business office. Copies of these maps have been filed previously with the CRTC.
- will file a copy of its PIC/CARE Handbook with the Commission for its approval coincident with the first request Wightman receives for equal access. Wightman will use the most recent CISC PIC/CARE Handbook available at the time.
- has exchanged the minimum set of CCS7 message types and has configured its network to ensure that customer privacy is protected by enabling the following features:
 - Delivery of the privacy indicator when invoked by an end-user.
 - Provision of automated universal per call blocking of calling line identification.
 - Provision of per line call display blocking to qualified end customers.
 - Disallowance of Call Return to a blocked number; and
 - Provision of universal Call Trace.
- have procedures in place to enforce the Commission's restrictions on Automatic Dialing-Announcing Devices, Automatic Dialing Devices and unsolicited facsimiles applicable in Bell Canada's territory.
- has through our affiliation with Wightman Telecom Ltd.,
 - contacted the Canadian Numbering Consortium
 - joined the Canadian LNP Consortium, and
 - participated in the Canadian Portable Contribution Consortium
- has provided the Commission with compliance of all ownership and control regulations in previous registration documentation.

Copies of this letter will be provided to the Central Fund Administrator, the three consortia and all LEC's and proposed CLECs operating in Wightmans serving areas.
