Conditions of licence and encouragement for the radio broadcasting undertakings CKVI-FM Kingston, Ontario, and CKIA-FM Québec, CKRL-FM Québec and CFLX-FM Sherbrooke, Quebec

Conditions of licence

1. The licence will be subject to the conditions set out in *New licence form for community radio stations*, Public Notice CRTC 2000-157, 16 November 2000.
2. The licensee shall devote, in each broadcast week, 12% or more of its musical selections from content category 3 (Special interest music) to Canadian selections broadcast in their entirety.
