



## Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC 2007-107

#### 1. **Toronto (Peel/Mississauga) & Richmond Hill, Ontario** **Application No. 2007-1155-8**

Application by **Rogers Cable Communications Inc.** (Rogers) to extend the service areas of the cable broadcasting distribution undertakings serving the above-mentioned locations as follows:

- For the undertaking serving Toronto (Peel/Mississauga): by including the portion of the Halton region, not already served by Rogers, comprising of Oakville, Burlington, Milton and Halton Hills.
- For the undertaking serving Richmond Hill: by including Aurora.

Rogers also proposes to amend the licence of its Toronto (Peel/Mississauga) undertaking as follows:

- by deleting the reference to CKCO-TV Kitchener from the following condition of licence:

The licensee is relieved from the requirements of section 17 of the *Broadcasting Distribution Regulations* with respect to CKVR-TV Barrie and CKCO-TV Kitchener, provided that they are distributed as part of the basic service.

- by adding the following condition of licence :

The licensee is relieved from the requirements of section 17 of the *Broadcasting Distribution Regulations* to distribute CKCO-TV Kitchener, as part of the basic service.

Rogers states that the CTV affiliate from Kitchener (CKCO-TV) is a regional TV station and therefore not considered a priority signal in relation to Rogers' existing Toronto (Peel/Mississauga) authorized service area. Rogers states that it distributes CFTO-TV Toronto, the local CTV affiliate, as part of its analog basic cable service and only offers CKCO-TV to its digital customers.

Rogers states that CKCO-TV is considered a local TV station in relation to parts of the Halton region it now proposes to serve. Rogers notes that, in Decision CRTC 2001-255, Rogers was granted a condition of licence relieving it from the requirement to distribute CFTO-TV as part of the basic service in its Guelph and Grand River cable systems, since CFTO-TV and CKCO-TV are both considered local TV stations in relation to Guelph and Grand River and the Commission concluded that CFTO-TV was largely duplicative of CKCO-TV.

Rogers states that it is on this basis that it requests the above condition of licence amendments.

2. **Watson Lake, Yukon Territory**  
**Application No. 2007-1269-7**

Application by the **Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC)** relating to the licence of the radio programming undertaking CFWH Whitehorse, Yukon Territory.

The CBC proposes to change the authorized contours of the transmitter CBDB Watson Lake by increasing the transmitter power from 40 watts to a daytime transmitter power of 400 watts and a nighttime transmitter power of 165 watts.

The CBC indicates that the increase in power will significantly improve both daytime and nighttime coverage in Watson Lake and surrounding areas.

The Commission notes that the increase in power would change the status of CBDB from a low power unprotected service to a regular Class C service.

The Commission also notes that the authorized contours of the transmitter will be increased significantly resulting from the proposed increase in power.
