Application by **591991 B.C. Ltd.** to amend the licence of the radio programming undertaking CIGR-FM Sherbrooke.

The licensee proposes to delete the condition of licence relating to the development of Canadian content which reads:

8. Upon commencement of operations, in addition to the basic annual contribution to Canadian content development, the licensee shall make an annual contribution of \$9,429 to the promotion and development of Canadian content (DCC). The licensee shall devote at least 20% of this amount annually to FACTOR or MUSICACTION, with the remainder to be paid to parties or initiatives fulfilling the definition of eligible initiatives in *Commercial Radio Policy 2006*, Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC [2006-158](#), 15 December 2006.

The request to delete condition of licence 8 is designed to correct the situation described below:

In Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2007-435, the Commission approved in part an application by 591991 B.C. Ltd. (Corus) to acquire the assets of the radio programming undertaking CIGR-FM Sherbrooke. This approval was subject to a condition of approval under which Corus was required to submit, within 30 days of this decision, a tangible benefits package that amounts to a minimum of \$66,000.

In response to this condition of approval, the licensee proposed to pay annual tangible benefits in the amount of \$9,429 over its seven-year licence term. However, in its application for acquisition of the assets of CIGR-FM Sherbrooke, Corus inadvertently attributed the sums to be paid out as tangible benefits to the development of Canadian content, as an over and above contribution.

Please note that the applicant is still subject to the condition of approval regarding the tangible benefits package that amounts to a minimum of \$66,000.
