Application by **V Interactions Inc.** to amend the term “broadcast day” for the purposes of the conditions of licence for the following television programming undertakings: V network, CFAP-TV Québec, CFJP-TV Montréal, CFKM-TV Trois Rivières, CFKS-TV Sherbrooke, CFRS-TV Saguenay and CFJP-DT Montréal.

The broadcast day for each of these undertakings is currently defined as an 18-hour period beginning at 7:00 a.m. each day. The licensee proposes to amend the definition of the term broadcast day to mean an 18 hour period beginning at 6:00 a.m. each day.

The licensee proposes that the amendment be retroactive to 1 September 2008.

The licensee states that the retroactivity will allow it to correct some logging inaccuracies.

The amended definition of the broadcast day will not significantly affect the conditions of licence pertaining to each undertaking’s nature of service or any other condition of licence.

Application by **CTV Television Inc.** (CTV) to amend the broadcasting licence for the specialty television programming undertaking known as The Comedy Network in order to provide the licensee with increased flexibility in fulfilling its described video programming commitments.

In *Accessibility of telecommunications and broadcasting services*, Broadcasting and Telecom Regulatory Policy CRTC 2009-430, 21 July 2009, the Commission invited conventional broadcasters to apply to amend their licences in order to provide these broadcasters with a measure of flexibility and to take into account requests from persons with disabilities for a wider choice of described programming. The Commission considered it appropriate to add two more program categories to those that licensees of

conventional television stations may use to fulfil their commitments to described video, namely categories 9 Variety and 11 General entertainment and human interest.

CTV is seeking similar flexibility for The Comedy Network and requests the addition of program categories 9 and 11 to the list of categories from which The Comedy Network may draw programming in order to meet its described video requirements.

**3. Owen Sound, Ontario**  
**Application No. 2009-1734-6**

Application by **Larche Communications Inc.** (Larche) relating to the broadcasting licence for the English-language commercial FM radio programming undertaking CJOS-FM Owen Sound.

The licensee proposes to change the location of the transmission site, to change the authorized contours by decreasing the effective radiated power from 20,000 watts to 9,400 watts (non-directional antenna whose effective height of the antenna above average terrain would increase from 212 metres to 214 metres).

Larche indicated that Bayshore Broadcasting Corporation (Bayshore), licensee of CKYC-FM and CIXK-FM Owen Sound, plans to consolidate the transmitting facilities of those two stations at a new site. Larche proposes to re-locate CJOS-FM's transmitter to the same site as the one used by Bayshore's Owen Sound stations. According to Larche, the proposed changes will provide more efficient coverage and result in short and long term cost savings.

The Commission notes that this application is contingent upon approval of Bayshore's applications 2010-0017-4 and 2010-0016-6.

**4. Owen Sound, Ontario**  
**Application No. 2010-0016-6**

Application by **Bayshore Broadcasting Corporation** (Bayshore) relating to the broadcasting licence for the English-language commercial FM radio programming undertaking CIXK-FM Owen Sound.

The licensee proposes to change the location of the transmission site, to change the authorized contours by decreasing the effective radiated power from 100,000 watts to 63,000 watts (non-directional antenna with an effective height of the antenna above average terrain 189.6 metres).

The licensee is requesting authority to amalgamate the transmitter sites of CIXK-FM and CKYC-FM (see application 2010-0017-4) into one transmission site in Owen Sound.

The licensee states that the change in transmitter site will reduce costs in site rentals and operating expenses.

Further, the licensee states that the transmitter lease for CIXK-FM expires in September 2010.

The licensee indicated that this application is not severable from application 2010-0017-4.

**5. Owen Sound, Ontario**

Application by **Bayshore Broadcasting Corporation** (Bayshore) relating to the broadcasting licence for the English-language commercial FM radio programming undertaking CKYC-FM Owen Sound.

The licensee proposes to change the location of the transmission site, to change the authorized contours by decreasing the effective radiated power from 31,600 watts to 24,000 watts (non-directional antenna with an effective height of the antenna above average terrain 214 metres).

The licensee is requesting authority to amalgamate the transmitter sites of CIXK-FM and CKYC-FM (see application 2010-0016-6) into one transmission site in Owen Sound.

The licensee states that the change in transmitter site will reduce costs in site rentals and operating expenses.

The licensee indicated that this application is not severable from application 2010-0016-6.

**7. Abbotsford, British Columbia**  
**Application No. 2009-1542-3**

Application by **UCFV Campus and Community Radio Society** for an extension of the time limit to implement the new English-language community-based campus FM radio station in Abbotsford approved in *Community-based campus FM radio station in Abbotsford, British Columbia*, Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2006-70, 14 March 2006.

The applicant has requested an extension until 6 September 2010. The Commission notes that this would be a third extension of the time limit to implement the service. Previous extensions have been granted to allow the applicant to seek technical parameters acceptable to the Commission and to the Department of Industry.

The Commission's standard practice is to grant a maximum of two extensions for a total of up to 24 months. In this instance, the applicant is requesting an extension of 30 months in total.

The applicant states that the current request for an extension is necessary in order to pursue a frequency exchange with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC). The applicant has indicated that it intends to submit an application for a frequency exchange with the CBC that will allow both parties to address issues of unacceptable interference for their respective radio stations.

A true copy must be sent to the applicant, and proof that this has been done must accompany the intervention sent to the Commission.

Submissions longer than five pages should include a summary.

In addition, where the intervention is filed by electronic means, the line **\*\*\*End of document\*\*\*** should be entered following the last paragraph of the document, as an indication that the document has not been damaged during electronic transmission.

Interventions should clearly identify the application referred to and indicate whether parties support or oppose the application, or, if they propose changes to it, include the facts and grounds for their proposal.
