#### 1. **Moncton, New Brunswick** **Application 2011-0030-5**

Application by **Instant Information Services Incorporated** to amend the broadcasting licence for the English-language low-power tourist information radio programming undertaking CIRM-FM Moncton to change the frequency from 90.1 MHz (channel 211LP) to 96.3 MHz (channel 242A) and to change the authorized contours by increasing the effective radiated power from 22.4 to 500 watts (non-directional antenna with an effective height of antenna above average terrain 63.5 metres).

The proposed technical amendment seeks to ensure that the entire urban population of Greater Moncton is able to receive safety and emergency messages. The licensee also wishes to operate its station on a protected frequency.

The Commission notes that, with the proposed changes, the population in the 3 mV/m and 0.5 mV/m contours would increase from 25,000 to 125,000 (400%) and from 40,000 to 135,000 (238%), respectively.

**2. Ottawa, Ontario**  
**Application 2011-0029-7**

Application by **Torres Media Ottawa Inc.** to amend the broadcasting licence for the English-language commercial radio programming undertaking CIDG-FM Ottawa to change the authorized contours by increasing the average effective radiated power (ERP) from 934 to 1,793 watts (maximum ERP from 4,500 watts to 5,500 watts with an effective height of antenna above average terrain of 98 metres).

The proposed amendment seeks to better serve the communities of Ottawa and Gatineau and to respond to hundreds of listener complaints about signal strength in the Ottawa/Gatineau region.

The Commission notes that, with the proposed changes, the population in the 3 mV/m and 0.5 mV/m contours would increase from 462,901 to 606,203 (31%) and from 765,086 to 906,608 (19%), respectively.

A true copy must be sent to the applicant, and proof that this has been done must accompany the intervention sent to the Commission.

The Commission advises those who file and serve by electronic mode to exercise caution when using e-mail for service of documents or notification, as it may be difficult to establish that service has occurred.

Parties must ensure that, before initiating service through electronic mode, they will be able to satisfy the Commission, upon request, that service of the notification was completed.

Submissions longer than five pages should include a summary.

Each paragraph of the submission should be numbered. In addition, where the intervention is filed by electronic means, the line **\*\*\*End of document\*\*\*** should be entered following the last paragraph of the document, as an indication that the document has not been damaged during electronic transmission.

Interventions should clearly identify the application referred to and indicate whether parties support or oppose the application, or, if they propose changes to it, include the facts and grounds for their proposal.
